



Key FGDM Take-Aways for Delinquent Youth

Ask Delinquent Youth about their Family and Friends

Provide Family and Friends information to the Court

80/20

Communication is Key in Dually Adjudicated Cases

Allow Family to drive the FGDM Plan and bring the FGDM Plan into the JPO Case Plan

Challenge historical thinking traps about delinquent youth and their families
