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State Supreme Court to Host First Annual Children's Summit Dependency Court Judges, Children and Youth Officials Collaborate to Help Dependent Children

HARRISBURG, November 18, 2009 – On Thursday, November 19 beginning at 1p.m. in the Pittsburgh Omni William Penn, the State Supreme Court will host Pennsylvania's First Annual Children's Roundtable Summit where county dependency court judges, and children and youth service professionals will collaborate with national experts to develop county specific plans to help abused and neglected children. **Your coverage is invited.**

State Supreme Court Chief Justice Ronald D. Castille and Justices J. Michael Eakin and Max Baer, will be present. Chief Justice Castille, Allegheny County President Judge Donna Jo McDaniel, and State Court Administrator Zygmont Pines will provide opening remarks for the three-day summit. Sandy Moore, Administrator, Office of Children and Families in the Courts, and Lehigh County Common Pleas Court Judge Brian Johnson will present a Child Dependency System Mission Statement & Guiding Principles document and unveil a Dependency System Logo and new Office of Children and Families in the Court's (OCFC) website aimed at assisting judges and legal professionals, parents and families, and children with dependency issues.

Officials from more than 50 counties throughout the state will be participating in the summit. They will hear from national experts, including Judge Stephen Rubin, Pima County, Arizona; Judge Charles Pratt, Allen County, Indiana; Judith Silver, PhD, Pediatric Psychologist Children's Hospital of Philadelphia; Larry Brown, Casey Family Programs Consultant, and Barbara Needell, PhD, Researcher, University of California at Berkeley. These experts will provide a national perspective of the work being done to help dependent children and families and share strategies used to successfully address issues similar to those facing Pennsylvania's child dependency system.

The protection and best interests of children has been the primary purpose of the nation's juvenile courts. The increased complexity of child and family issues are significant challenges for the court as it struggles to meet its historic purpose. The need for true court reform based on evidence based practices is clear. Court reform that incorporates dependency mediation and similar strength based practices will give extended families the opportunity to serve as partners in a child's protection, will lend the court greater legitimacy from multiple community sectors and interest groups, will better enable the court to meet state and federal outcomes, and will better serve the needs of the families and children that the court was created to serve. This presentation will highlight sound research that, when holistically considered, will support a significant paradigm shift in Dependency Courts.

Channeling King Solomon: Reducing Disrupted Relationships and Improving Permanency

Discontinuity of relationships is a central feature of children's experiences within the child dependency system. The impact of family separation is inevitably compounded by additional changes in placement and caregivers. Decision makers often confront less than optimal choices to ensure children's safety, well-being, and permanency. This session will address the impact of family separation on young children and their parents and a strategic approach to visitation. Helping children deal with transitions among relationships and assessment of caregiver capacity for reunification will be discussed.

Making Data Informed Decisions

Data can be overwhelming and obfuscate or it can be laser-like in pointing to issues and tracking progress. The key is in knowing which kinds of data are most helpful in advancing understanding and which create problems. Strategies for selecting the proper data that will help you see and manage change will be advanced. Experiences with communicating publicly about data, watching for unintended consequences and tying broad outcomes to front-line practice will be explored. County teams will be asked to look at their respective child welfare and court data to select what will be most helpful in advancing their system improvements.
